Some of the children also dressed up for World Book Day! Take a look at their amazing outfits!

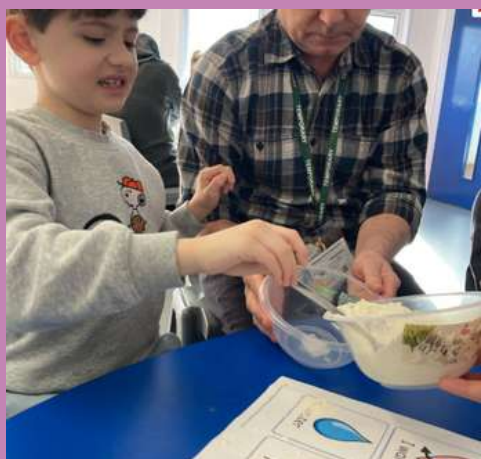




Lavender Class News
